NATIONAL MEASLES INCIDENT: Call for immediate action

The UK Health Security Agency has recently declared a national incident following measles outbreaks in London and the West Midlands. They have indicated that we are highly likely to see cases spread.

Measles is highly infectious disease and spreads very easily among those who are unvaccinated. Measles can be a very unpleasant illness and in some children can be very serious. The measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine is a safe and highly effective way to protect children from three infectious diseases: measles, mumps, and rubella. Two doses are required to offer the best protection.

Year 10 Law Workplace safari


